A BILL

To approve, on an emergency basis, Modification Nos. 0028 and 0029 to Contract No. CW26966 with Conduent State Healthcare, LLC to enhance and implement a federally-owned and certifiable Medicaid Management Information System and to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under the contract.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA,

(C) The goods or services to be provided, the methods of delivering goods or services, and any significant program changes reflected in the proposed contract:

The purpose of option period two is to enhance and implement a federally owned and certifiable Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS). The contractor shall enhance the MMIS by using current information technology to enable the efficient and responsive operation of the District's Medicaid Program, and to provide additional services which are federally mandated updates to the District's MMIS and the Medicaid Statistical Information System (MSIS) in order to maintain compliance with the US Department of Health Human Services Center for the Medicaid and Medicare Service (CMS).

(D) The selection process, including the number of Offeror's, the evaluation criteria, and the evaluation results, including price, technical or quality, and past performance components:

The Office of Contracting and Procurement issued a Request for Proposals (RFP), solicitation No. POTO-2006-R-0077 on June 30, 2006 in the open market to solicit proposals for services to provide, enhance and implement a federally owned and certified or certifiable Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS). The District received one proposal from ACS State Healthcare, LLC (ACS). The proposal was evaluated in accordance with the technical and price evaluation factors as described in the RFP, and OCP awarded a multiyear contract for the period of performance from September 10, 2007 through September 9, 2014. During that contract term, ACS changed its name to Xerox State Healthcare, LLC (Xerox).

In September 2014, OCP issued a sole source extension of the contract for the period of September 9, 2014 through September 30, 2016 in the amount of \$37,297,137. This extension was for a period of two years and 21 days, and allowed for two additional one-year options. OCP exercised the first option year for the period of October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017, in the amount of \$19,303,820. In June 2017, Xerox changed its name to Conduent State Healthcare, LLC. Additionally, OCP exercised a partial exercise of option year two in the amount of \$981,031.63 for the period of October 1st through 18th, 2017. OCP now proposes to exercise the remainder of option year two for the period of October 19, 2017 through September 30, 2018. The total amount for option year two is \$19,893,141.40.

(E) A description of any bid protest related to the award of the contract, including whether the protest was resolved through litigation, withdrawal of the protest by the protestor, or voluntary corrective action by the District. (F) The background and qualifications of the proposed contractor, including its organization, financial stability, personnel, and performance on past or current government or private sector contracts with requirements similar to those of the proposed contract:

Conduent State Healthcare, LLC currently provides MMIS systems to a number of states and the District of Columbia and has demonstrated through its performance under the contract that the Contractor maintains the organization, financial stability, and personnel to perform the required services.

Conduent State Healthcare, LLC has adequate financial resources to perform the contract or the ability to obtain those resources, based on its Bidder/Offeror Certification Form, and Dun and Bradstreet report.

Conduent State Healthcare, LLC has, or has the ability to obtain, the necessary organization, experience, accounting, operational control, and technical skills, based on the contractor currently providing the required services, and on the positive performance evaluations;

Conduent State Healthcare, LLC has held a number of contracts with the District over the past ten (10) years including serving as the District's enrollment broker for the DC Healthy Families Program (POHC-2004-R-9390), providing HIPAA Security implementation for the District's MMIS System (POHC-2006-C-0022). The program office provided past performance evaluation that were satisfactory.

The Contractor has been determined responsible based on the District's standard of responsibility as described in D.C. Official Code §2-353.01.

(G) The period of performance associated with the proposed change, including date as of which the proposed change is to be made effective:

A partial modification (Modification No. 0028) to Option Period Two was issued for the period October 1, 2017 through October 18, 2017 in the amount of \$981,031.63. The remainder of Option Period Two (Modification No. 0029) is for the period of October 19, 2017 to September 30, 2018.

(H) The value of any work or services performed pursuant to a proposed change for which the Council has not provided approval, disaggregated by each propose change if more than one proposed change has been aggregated for Council review:

Modification No. 0028 was issued in the amount of \$981,031.63. Proposed Modification No. 0029 is in the amount of \$18,912,109.77.

(I) The aggregate dollar value of the proposed changes as compared with the amount of the contract as awarded:

The total amount of option period two is \$19,893,141.40.

(J) The date on which the contracting officer was notified of the proposed change:

September 29, 2017.

(K) The reason why the proposed change was sent to Council for approval after it is intended to take effect:

The Medicaid claims processing services were critical services that needed to be continued without disruption.

(L) The reason for the proposed change:

The District exercised the partial option period two to continue critical Medicaid claims processing services.

(M) The legal, regulatory, or contractual authority for the proposed change:

(N) A summary of the subcontracting plan required under section 2346 of the Small, Local, and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Development and Assistance Act of 2005, as amended, D.C. The contractor provided a Subcontracting Plan with a Set Aside of 13.5 % with a total dollar amount of \$2,685,574.09. The Contracting Officer has determined that the plan meets the DSLBD requirements.

(O) Performance standards and the expected outcome of the proposed contract:

The purpose of this modification is to obtain required MMIS updates and enhancements to ensure the District's continued compliance with CMS requirements.

The District requires Conduent to continue operating its federally certified MMIS. This system supports the traditional fee-for-services delivery model for the District's Medicaid enrollees and is essential to ensure timely payment to health care providers treating a wide portfolio of medical needs. The contractor will perform in accordance with the performance standards set forth in the contract.

(P) The amount and date of any expenditure of funds by the District pursuant to the contract prior to its submission to the Council for approval:

Modification No. 0028 was issued in the amount of \$981,031.63.

(Q) A certification that the proposed contract is within the appropriated budget authority for the agency for the fiscal year and is consistent with the financial plan and budget adopted in accordance with D.C. Official Code §§ 47-392.01 and 47-392.02:

By Memorandum, dated August 8, 2017 the Agency Fiscal Officer certified that funds in the amount of \$19,893,141.40 are available in FY18.

(R) A certification that the contract is legally sufficient, including whether the proposed contractor has any pending legal claims against the District:

The proposed contract has been reviewed by the Office of the Attorney General and found to be legally sufficient. There are no pending legal claims against the District.


