

17 To repeal requirements restricting the authority of the Executive Branch to use the Contingency
18 Cash Reserve to respond to nonrecurring or unforeseen changes to the budget; to raise the
19 reprogramming threshold from \$500,000 to \$1 million; and to eliminate restrictions on
20 the Executive's ability to reprogram debt service funds.

22 BE IT ENACTED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
23 act may be cited as the "Executive Branch Budget Implementation Flexibility Amendment Act
24 of 2017".

25 TITLE I. REPEALERS.

26 Sec. 101. Section 3 of the Fiscal Year 2018 Federal Portion Budget Request Act of 2017,
27 approved on final reading on May 31, 2017 (D.C. Act 22-98) is repealed.

28 Sec. 102. The Contingency Cash Reserve Transparency Amendment Act of 2008,
29 enacted on January 29, 2008 (D.C. Act 17-278; 55 DCR 1530), is repealed.

30 TITLE II. AMENDMENTS.

31 Sec. 201. Section 47-318.05a is repealed.

32 Sec. 202. Section 47-361(14) is amended by striking the number "\$500,000" wherever it
33 appears and inserting the number "\$1 million" in its place.

34 Sec. 203. Section 47-362(f) is repealed.

1 TITLE III. FISCAL IMPACT; EFFECTIVE DATE

2 Sec. 301. Fiscal impact statement.

3 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
4 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
5 approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

6 Sec. 302. Effective date.

7 The act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
8 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
9 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
10 24, 1973, (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
11 Columbia Register.
