## Dear Chairman Mendelson:

Enclosed for consideration and approval by the Council of the District of Columbia ("Council"), is the "Nursing Facility Quality of Care Fund Amendment Act of 2018". The purpose of this bill is to amend the Nursing Facility Quality of Care Fund to allow for an updated reimbursement methodology that considers the acuity of nursing facility residents and increases the promotion of care, safety, and health of nursing facility residents.

As the health industry continues to move towards value-based purchasing, changes to the reimbursement of nursing facilities have followed. This bill redefines the methodology on which reimbursement is made to nursing facilities so that focus is placed on the acuity and special needs of residents, as opposed to the structure of the facility. Additionally, it allows for performance payments that reward District nursing facilities that demonstrate improvements or high levels of performance.

This legislation modernizes and unifies the changes being made not only for nursing facilities, but in the field of healthcare. Approval of this legislation allows the District to use its dollars in a way that is more advantageous to its financial plan and its residents.

I look forward to a favorable consideration of this legislation.

Chairman Phil Mendelson at the Request of the Mayor A BILL IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To amend the Nursing Facility Quality of Care Fund to update the reimbursement methodology to consider acuity of nursing facility residents and increase promotion of care, safety, and health of nursing facility residents. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Nursing Facility Quality of Care Fund Amendment Act of 2018". Sec. 2. Section 5202 of the "Fiscal Year 2005 Budget Support Act of 2004" effective December 7, 2004 (D.C. Law 15-205; D.C. Official Code § 47-1261), is amended as follows: (a) Subsection (c) (D.C. Official Code § 47-1261) is amended as follows: (1) Paragraph (1) is amended to read as follows: "(1) Case mix reimbursement methodology" means a prospective Medicaid payment rate system for nursing facilities that includes a resident classification system based on resident acuity and needs." (2) Paragraph (8) is amended as follows: (A) Strike the phrase ", to the extent that amounts in the Fund remain," Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement. The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved 

December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

41 Sec. 4. Effective date.

 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

#### Conclusion

Funds are sufficient in fiscal year 2018 and in the fiscal year 2019 through 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill.

#### Background

The bill updates¹ the reimbursement methodology for the Nursing Facility Quality of Care Fund which is administered by the Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF). The bill requires DHCF to consider acuity of nursing facility residents and promote the care, safety, and health of nursing facility residents when making payments to nursing homes for care.

## Financial Plan Impact

Funds are sufficient in fiscal year 2018 and in the fiscal year 2019 through 2022 budget and financial plan to implement the bill. DHCF currently uses the Quality of Care Fund to pay nursing homes for quality of care improvements and to reimburse the nursing homes for care provided to Medicaid patients. The bill updates the D.C. Code to reflect current practice.
