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21 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

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26 To create a parking permit class for disabled veterans and Purple Heart recipients that provides
27 free short-term parking at all District owned and operated lots, garages, meters, and pay
28 stations.

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30 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
31 act may be cited as the "District Wounded Warrior Parking Permit Act of 2019".

32 Sec. 2. Eligibility and requirements.

33 (a) There is established a Wounded Warrior Parking Permit for free short-term parking of
34 24 hours or less at all District owned and operated lots, garages, meters, and pay stations.

35 (b) To be eligible for a Wounded Warrior Parking Permit, a person shall be a District
36 resident who is a disabled veteran or Purple Heart recipient.

37 (c) The District Department of Transportation shall provide recipients with a physical
38 permit indicating the recipient is a Wounded Warrior Parking Permit holder. The permit shall be

1 displayed in the windshield of the vehicle when the vehicle is parked at a District-owned lot,
2 garage, meter, or pay station.

3 (d) The Mayor, pursuant to subtitle I of the District of Columbia Administrative
4 Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*),
5 shall issue rules to implement the provisions of this act.

6 Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement

7 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
8 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
9 approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

10 Sec. 4. Effective date.

11 The act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
12 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
13 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
14 24, 1973, (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
15 Columbia Register.
