14 15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
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16	act may be cited as the "Office on Caribbean Affairs Establishment Act of 2019".
17	Sec. 2. Establishment of the Office on Caribbean Affairs.
18	(a) There is established an Office on Caribbean Affairs ("OCA"), which shall monitor
19	service delivery and make policy recommendations to the Mayor and Council regarding housing,
20	health, education, employment, social services, public safety, and business opportunities for the
21	District's Caribbean community.
22	(b) OCA shall be headed by an Executive Director, who shall be appointed by the Mayor
23	with the advice and consent of the Council pursuant to section 2(a) of the Confirmation Act of
24	1978, effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Official Code § 1-523.01(a)). The
25	Executive Director shall be a full-time position, for which annual compensation shall be fixed in
26	accordance with Title X-A of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit
27	Personnel Act of 1978, effective June 10, 1998 (D.C. Law 12-124; D.C. Official Code § 1-

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28	610.51 <i>et seq.</i>). The Executive Director shall have such staff as is appropriated in an approved
29	budget or provided through federal or private grants.
30	Sec. 3. Duties of the Executive Director.
31	(a) The Executive Director shall:
32	(1) Serve as an advocate for the needs of the District's Caribbean community, as
33	those needs relate to housing, health, education, employment, social services, public safety, and
34	expanding business opportunities;
35	(2) Assist community organizations in developing and submitting grant
36	applications;
37	(3) Provide information and technical assistance on programs and services for the
38	Caribbean community to the Mayor, the Council, Advisory Neighborhood Commissions, other
39	District government agencies, and the community;
40	(4) Respond to recommendations and policy statements from the Mayor's
41	Advisory Commission on Caribbean Community Affairs ("MACCCA"), established by Mayor's
42	Order 2012-127;
43	(5) File with the Mayor and the Council, no later than December 31 annually, an
44	annual report on the operations of OCA based on the previous fiscal year;
45	(6) Identify areas for service improvement and make recommendations to the
46	Mayor and MACCCA for improving services; and

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47	(7) Ensure the necessary control, evaluation, audit, and reporting on programs
48	funded through OCA.
49	(b) The Executive Director may:
50	(1) Accept volunteer services and funds from the public and private sectors to
51	supplement the budget of OCA in carrying out its planning duties and responsibilities;
52	(2) Apply for, receive, and expend gifts or grants of money to carry out the duties
53	and responsibilities of OCA; and
54	(3) Issue grants, in accordance with the requirements set forth in requirements set
55	forth in the Grant Administration Act of 2013, effective December 24, 2013 (D.C. Law 20-61;
56	D.C. Official Code § 1-328.11 et seq.), to organizations that provide housing, education, health,
57	workforce development, employment, criminal justice reform, and economic opportunity-related
58	services to the District's Caribbean community.
59	Sec. 4. Applicability
60	(a) This act shall apply upon the date of inclusion of its fiscal effect in an approved
61	budget and financial plan.
62	(b) The Chief Financial Officer shall certify the date of the inclusion of the fiscal effect in
63	an approved budget and financial plan, and provide notice to the Budget Director of the Council
64	of the certification.
65	(c)(1) The Budget Director shall cause the notice of the certification to be published in
66	the District of Columbia Register.

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67	(2) The date of publication of the notice of the certification shall not affect the
68	applicability of this act.
69	Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.
70	The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
71	impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
72	approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).
73	Sec. 6. Effective date.
74	The act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
75	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
76	provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
77	24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
78	Columbia Register.
