- 36 (c) An applicant for a reserved parking space must be the owner of the vehicle in which
 37 the parking space is to be used, and the parking space can only be used by the owner if that
 38 owner is the driver of the vehicle or a passenger in it.
 - (d) Reserved parking spaces are subject to renewal every 3 years.
- 40 (e) For the purposes of this act, the term "reasonable physical hardship" means any
 41 doctor-certified physical or medical hardship that poses a difficulty on the resident in entering his
 42 or her residence.
