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Sec. 2. Definitions.

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45	For the purposes of this act, the term:	
46	(1) "Community health worker" means a member of the community who shares	
47	ethnicity, language, and life experiences with the population the individual is serving and	
48	provides nonclinical support in the form of education, guidance, advocacy, and certain direct	
49	services to community members as they navigate the local health care system	
50	(2) "Culturally congruent care" means care that considers and is in agreement	
51	with the preferred cultural values, beliefs, worldview, and practices of the individual receiving	
52	care.	
53	(3) "Perinatal" means the period before, during, and after delivery through the	
54	postnatal period.	
55	Sec. 3. Perinatal health worker training program.	
56	(a) Within 120 days of the effective date of this act, the Department of Health shall	
57	disburse grant funds annually to an entity to implement a perinatal health worker training	
58	program that trains individuals in Wards 5, 7, and 8 to provide culturally congruent nonclinical	
59	care to individuals during their perinatal period. The program shall provide:	
60	(1) Didactic training regarding:	
61	(A) Reproductive health, including the physical, mental, and social well-	
62	being related to the functioning of the reproductive system;	
63	(B) Pregnancy, labor, and postpartum assistance;	
64	(C) Child birth, including complications and risk factors;	
65	(D) Lactation, including basic breastfeeding information and how to	
66	support breastfeeding;	
67	(E) Fetal and newborn physical and cognitive development;	

68	(F) Maternal and newborn nutrition;	
69	(G) Perinatal mood disorders and assessment tools;	
70	(J) Fertility, family planning, and contraception options;	
71	(K) History of women of color's reproductive health;	
72	(M) Cultural competency;	
73	(N) Health equity and reproductive justice;	
74	(O) Communication skills, including how to give and receive written and	
75	verbal instructions, communicate clearly and effectively, and interpret and explain information to	
76	others;	
77	(P) Charting and documentation;	
78	(Q) Data tracking and collection; and	
79	(R) Principles of adult learning and how adults learn new information and	
80	skills.	
81	(2) Opportunities to shadow experienced maternal health professionals and attend	
82	live births.	
83	(b)(1) The selected entity shall be an established organization with experience providing	
84	nonclinical perinatal support services to guide individuals through pregnancy, delivery, and the	
85	postpartum period that helps the individual make informed decisions about their medical care,	
86	parenting choices, and overall health.	
87	(2) The selected entity shall recruit a majority of candidates for trainings from	
88	Wards 5, 7, and 8 to provide health and human services career pathways for individuals.	
89	(3) The entity shall use a community health worker model and train individuals	
90	who are members of the community and neighborhoods they will serve.	

91	(c) The grant shall include funds designated for training materials, space, financial aid
92	and scholarships for participants, communications, outreach, instructors, and facilitators.

94	The Mayor, pursuant to Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Ac
