35	(a) There is established a Public Housing Rehabilita	ation Oversight Task Force ("Task
36	Force") to provide the Mayor, the Council, and the District	of Columbia Housing Authority
37	("Authority") with comprehensive information and policy is	recommendations on the Authority's
