



28 To amend on an emergency basis, the District of Columbia Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act
29 of 1978 to change the name of the legal holiday celebrated on the 2nd Monday in October
30 from Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples' Day; and to amend sections 25-723 and 28-
31 2701 of the District of Columbia Official Code to do the same.

33 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That
34 this act may be cited as the "Indigenous Peoples' Day Emergency Amendment Act of 2019".

35 Sec. 2. Section 1202(a)(7) of the District of Columbia Comprehensive Merit Personnel
36 Act of 1978, effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-319; D.C. Official Code § 1-612.02(a)(7)), is
37 amended by striking the phrase "Columbus Day" and inserting the phrase "Indigenous Peoples'
38 Day" in its place.

39 Sec. 3. Section 25-723(c)(1)(B) of the District of Columbia Official Code is amended by
40 striking the phrase “Columbus Day” and inserting the phrase “Indigenous Peoples’ Day” in its
41 place.

42 Sec. 4. Section 28-2701 of the District of Columbia Official Code is amended by striking
43 the phrase “Columbus Day” and inserting the phrase “Indigenous Peoples’ Day” in its place.

44 Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

45 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
46 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
47 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

48 Sec. 6. Effective date.

49 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
50 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than
51 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
52 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
53 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).


