Councilmember Mary M. A BILL IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To require the Deputy Mayor for Education to complete a comprehensive study on equitable funding of parent teacher organizations in the District. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Parent Teacher Organization Equity Study Act of 2020". Sec. 2. (a) Within 360 days after the effective date of this Act, the Deputy Mayor for Education shall complete a comprehensive study on equitable governance and funding of parent teacher organizations ("PTO") in the District. The study shall include: (1) A survey on the state of PTOs in the District, including a list of public schools with and without PTOs, and information, by PTO for School Year 2020-2021, on: (A) Membership size; (B) Conditions of membership, including whether the PTO charges dues or other fees; (C) Meeting frequency; (D) Age of the PTO; (E) Methods of communication with members, including whether the PTO utilizes a listsery, website, newsletter, or other communication tool; (F) Whether the PTO maintains its own bank account; and

33	(G) Whether the PIO has a mission statement of other formalized
34	document laying out goals and priorities of the PTO; and
35	(2) Best practices from other jurisdictions regarding:
36	(A) PTO funding and fundraising, including information on school
37	district-wide policies or practices aimed at promoting equity in the funding of PTOs; and
38	(B) Establishing and supporting PTOs at schools throughout a school
39	district, with a focus on ensuring the longevity of newly formed PTOs; and
40	(3) Recommendations for changes to District law and policy to promote best
41	practices for equitable funding and support of public school PTOs.
42	(b) For the purposes of this act, the term "parent teacher organization" means an entity
43	organized by the parents or guardians of students enrolled in a school to support the school's
44	student body, faculty and staff, or programming. The term "parent teacher organization" includes
45	parent teacher associations, local school advisory teams, and home and school associations.

48	impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,

51	This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
52	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as

54	24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
