Findings. 18 The Council finds that the Capital Pride Celebration: 19 (1) Is one of the largest celebrations in the United States honoring LGBTO+ 20 communities; 21 (2) Showcases a diversity of local, regional, and international talent: 22 (3) Brings together hundreds of organizations and businesses: 23 (4) Brings over a half million people to the District of Columbia; 24 (5) Brings tax revenue to the District government as a result of the many visitors 25 from the region and around the world that come to this celebration: 26 (6) Has paid many dollars over many years in fees to the District government for 27 city services and to meet special event requirements; and

- (7) Has a growing burden paying the ever-increasing fees causing difficulties for
   this celebration, which will be in its 45th year in 2020.
   Sec. 3. Notwithstanding the Grant Administration Act of 2013, effective December 24,
- 2013 (D.C. Law 20-61; D.C. Official Code § 1-328.11 *et seq.*), the Mayor, through the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development, shall provide in Fiscal Year 2020 a \$400,000 grant to the Capital Pride Alliance, a nonprofit organization located in the District, to be used for purposes related to the 2020 Pride in the Nation's Capital events and shall waive all city services fees and special event requirement fees beginning in Fiscal Year 2021 and each year thereafter.
  - Sec. 4. The Council of the District of Columbia orders that the city services fees and special event requirement fees ("fees") for 2019 be forgiven and that any payments of these fees made refunded to the entity who made the payments.
