Definitions. 27 For the purposes of this act, the term: 28 (1) "Superior Officer" means a Master Patrol Officer, Sergeant, Lieutenant, or 29 higher-ranking Officer that has supervision over the requesting Metropolitan Police Department ("MPD") officer. 30 31 Sec. 3. Prohibited pursuits. (a) An MPD officer is prohibited from conducting searches of unoccupied vehicles 32 33 unless: (1) A superior officer is present; 34

35	(2) All officers present in the search have their body cameras turned on and
36	functional;
37	(3) The officer requesting the search provides a reason verbally for conducting the
38	search and the reasons is recorded by the body camera; and
39	(4) The superior officer present at the search is viewed on the body cameras
40	giving verbal authorization for the search.
41	(b) A report by a MPD officer present at the search must be filed with the results of the
42	search;
43	(c) The owner of the vehicle shall be notified of the underlying reason for the search of
44	their vehicle; and
45	(d) The owner of the vehicle shall have the right to sue the individual officers not
46	adhering to this law in their individual capacity.

52	This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
53	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as

55	24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the district of
56	Columbia Register.
