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11 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA
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15 To waive, on an emergency basis due to congressional review, the Confirmation Act of
16 1978 to extend the period of time during which a person may be compensated and
17 waive the residency requirement while serving in an interim capacity as the State
18 Superintendent of Education.
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA,

22 That this act may be cited as the “Interim Term of the State Superintendent of Education
23 Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2021”.

24 Sec. 2. Section 2(a)(1) of the Confirmation Act of 1978, effective March 3, 1979
25 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Official Code § 1-523.01(a)(1)), shall not apply to the
26 compensation of a person serving in an interim capacity as the State Superintendent of
27 Education on or between April 6, 2021, and December 31, 2021.

28 Sec. 3. Section 103 of the Jobs for D.C. Residents Amendment Act of 2007,
29 effective February 6, 2008 (D.C. Law 17-108; D.C. Official Code § 1-515.03), shall not
30 apply to the residency of a person serving in an interim capacity as the State
31 Superintendent of Education on or between April 6, 2021, and December 31, 2021.

32 Sec. 4. Section 906(a) of The District of Columbia Government Comprehensive
33 Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective March 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-139; D.C. Official

34 Code § 1-609.06(a) shall not apply to the residency of a person serving in an interim
35 capacity as the State Superintendent of Education on or between April 6, 2021, and
36 December 31, 2021.

37 Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

38 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the
39 fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act
40 of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

41 Sec. 6. Effective date.

42 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto
43 by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for
44 no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of
45 Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
46 December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
