

2 Councilmember Trayon White, Sr. A BILL IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To require the District Department of Transportation to conduct a study to determine the feasibility and irregularities of existing stop signs on Martin Luther King Avenue and Southern Avenue in Ward 8. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA. That this act may be cited as the "Ward 8 MLK and Southern Avenue Stop Sign Study Act of 2021". Sec. 2. Feasibility Study. (a) The District Department of Transportation ("DDOT") shall conduct a study to determine the feasibility and irregularities of existing stop signs on Martin Luther King Avenue and Southern Avenue in Ward 8. (b) DDOT shall submit a copy of the study and its findings to the Council and the Mayor by December 1, 2022. Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement. The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D. C. Official Code § 1-301.47a). Sec. 4. Effective date. 

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the district of Columbia Register.
