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10	To amend, on a temporary basis, the District of Columbia Public Emergency Act of 1980 to
11	clarify the types of circumstances that may constitute a public emergency and to
12 13	authorize the Mayor to extend the duration of public emergencies related to the opioid crisis and juvenile crime, to authorize the Mayor to waive the requirements of the
14	Procurement Practices Reform Act of 2010 and the Grant Administration Act of 2013 in
15	exercising her authority under the public emergencies related to the opioid crisis and
16	juvenile crime, and to require the Mayor to provide written notice to the Council before
17	engaging in conduct that would require the waiver of the Procurement Practices Reform
18	Act of 2010 or Grant Administration Act of 2013.
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
22	act may be cited as the "Opioid Crisis and Juvenile Crime Public Emergencies Extension
23	Authorization Temporary Amendment Act of 2024".
24	Sec. 2. The District of Columbia Public Emergency Act of 1980, effective March 5, 1981
25	(D.C. Law 3-149; D.C. Official Code § 7-2301 et seq.), is amended as follows:
26	(a) Section 2(3)(I) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2301(3)(I)) is amended by striking the phrase
27	"communicable disease" and inserting the phrase "communicable disease, or significant
28	existence of a deadly or otherwise dangerous disease, disorder, condition, or activity," in its
29	place.

30	(b) Section 7 (D.C. Official Code § 7-2306) is amended by adding a new subsection (c-2)
31	to read as follows:
32	"(c-2)(1) Notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c) of this section, the Mayor may extend
33	the 15-day February 27, 2024, emergency executive order declaring a public emergency in
34	response to the opioid crisis (Mayor's Order 2024-035) and the 15-day February 27, 2024,
35	emergency executive order declaring a public emergency in response to juvenile crime (Mayor's
36	Order 2024-035) while the Opioid Crisis and Juvenile Crime Public Emergencies Extension
37	Authorization Temporary Amendment Act of 2024 is in effect (passed on first reading on March
38	5, 2024) (engrossed version of B25-XXX). After the extensions authorized by this subsection,
39	the Mayor may extend the emergency orders for additional 15-day periods pursuant to subsection
40	(b) or subsection (c) of this section.
41	"(2) Notwithstanding section 5(b) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2304(b)), the Mayor shall
42	comply with all District laws when exercising her authority pursuant to Mayor's Order 2024-
43	035, including those laws stated in Mayor's Order 2024-035 to be subject to waiver, suspension,
44	or modification; except, that the Mayor may waive the requirements of the Procurement
45	Practices Reform Act of 2010, effective April 8, 2011 (D.C. Law 18-371; D.C. Official Code §
46	2-354.01 et seq.), and the Grant Administration Act of 2013, effective December 24, 2013 (D.C.
47	Law 20-61; D.C. Official Code 1-328.11 et seq.).

48	"(3) The Mayor shall, prior to any exercise of the authority granted by this subsection,
49	provide written notice to the Council of any waiver under paragraph (2) of this subsection. Such
50	notice shall include, at a minimum:
51	"(A) Citations to the law or laws being waived; and
52	"(B) In any instance where the Mayor is waiving procurement laws, a
53	summary of each proposed procurement, which summary shall include:
54	"(i) A description of the specific goods or services to be procured;
55	"(ii) The source selection method, including whether the
56	procurement was competitively sourced;
57 58	"(iii) The contract amount and the source of funds, whether federal
59	or local; "(iv) The name and certified business enterprise status of the
60	proposed awardee; and
61	"(v) An explanation regarding why expedited procurement
62	procedures are necessary to meet the specific need identified.
63	"(4) The Mayor shall provide the Council with copies of any grants awarded or
64	contracts entered into using the authority granted by this subsection no later than 15 days after
65	awarding the grant or entering into the contract.".

73	Sec. 5. Effective date.
74	(a) This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by
75	the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review
76	as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
77	24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
78	Columbia Register.
79	(b) This act shall expire after 225 days of its having taken effect on September 17, 2024.
