WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club was organized in March 1960 by noted Author and Journalist Ethel Payne and a group of activist women as a means of speaking in support of women voices;

WHEREAS, the mission of the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club is to support the principles and programs of the Democratic Party and to work for the Party's bold causes at both the local and national levels by learning the techniques of political action;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club supports and espouses the tenets of the Democratic Party and is engaged in every level of the Democratic structure;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club is a member of the DC Federation of Democratic Women, the Democratic State Committee, the Democratic National Committee, and the National Federation of Democratic Women;

WHEREAS, since its inception, the members of the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club have contributed significantly to the growth and development of the District of Columbia;

WHEREAS, many members of the club have served in elected and appointed positions within District government;

WHEREAS, in June 1960, the members of the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club participated in the successful effort for the ratification of the 23rd Amendment, which gave to the residents of the District of Columbia the right to vote in presidential elections, and worked with the presidential assembly in organizing the basic political structure of the city;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic club is a strong proponent of Statehood and has worked on a local and national level for the District of Columbia to become the 5lst state;

WHEREAS, in June 1965, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club was one of the first women's groups to rally on the steps of Capitol Hill with activist and comedian Dick Gregory and other national and local leaders in support of DC Statehood;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club continued engaging women in local politics and addressed urban and civic issues through the lens of women voices during its organization of an annual Women in Blue Lobby Day with the DC City Council and, in March 2017, designed and initiated a national Women In Blue lobbying campaign, bringing National Federation of Democratic Women members from 43 states to Congress to advocate for issues supporting women, families and children;

WHEREAS, in March 2018, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club honored ten of its trailblazers on whose shoulders we stand and who continue to be engaged in community

affairs, charitable causes, voter registration and education efforts, empowering citizens to improve the quality of life within our city;

WHEREAS, three members of the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club have served as President of the National Federation of Democratic Women, two members were awarded the National Legislator of the Year recognition, and many other members previously and currently serve as regional directors of the National Federation of Democratic Women;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club serves as an advocate for women and is at the forefront of working for women rights, equal rights, human rights and the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment; and

WHEREAS, on Saturday, March 2lst at the InterContinental Hotel in Washington, DC, the Metropolitan Women's Democratic Club will celebrate 60 years of working in support of women voices, strengthening the Democratic Party, and helping elect Democrats at every level of government both locally and nationally.
