

Chairman Phil Mendelson, at the request of the Mayor, introduced the following resolution, which was referred to the Committee on _____.

To confirm the re-appointment of Sue Ann Marshall to the Housing Production Trust Fund Board.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Housing Production Trust Fund Board Sue Ann Marshall Confirmation Resolution of 2014".

Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia confirms the re-appointment of:

as a member, and a representative of the nonprofit housing production community, of the Housing Production Trust Fund Board, established by section 3a of the Housing Production Trust Fund Act of 1988, effective June 8, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-133; D.C. Official Code § 42-2802.01), for a term to end January 14, 2019.

Sec. 3. The Secretary to the Council shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, each to the nominee and to the Office of the Mayor.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

About Sue Marshall

Sue Marshall is the founding Executive Director of The Community Partnership for the Prevention of Homelessness, a nonprofit public/private partnership in the District of Columbia. The Community Partnership has managed the District of Columbia homeless Continuum of Care for the past sixteen years pursuant to a competitively procured contract with the District of Columbia Department of Human Services. In 1994, as the recipient of the first HUD Continuum of Care demonstration grant in the amount of \$20 million, the Partnership was the principal architect for the District's continuum. In its role as the implementing entity for the *D.C. Initiative on Homelessness*, the Partnership worked collaboratively with government, community and homeless service providers and advocates to create a performance-based system with quantitative and qualitative measures and reporting requirements.

Currently, the Partnership administers more than \$60 million of publicly funded services to the homeless in the District on an annual basis. The Community Partnership's program portfolio includes three rapid re-housing initiatives: Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing (HPRP), Child and Family Services Rapid Rehousing for youth aging out of foster care and the Rapid Rehousing for Homeless Families Demonstration Program, rental and utility assistance programs, emergency and transitional shelter as well as a robust Permanent Supportive Housing Program that uses the Community Care Grant Program (CCGP) as a model. CCGP is a housing first program developed in 1998 in conjunction with community-based organizations to provide homeless families an alternative to shelter. CCGP is recognized as a national best practice by the National Alliance to End Homelessness.

Sue has provided technical assistance to the cities of New York, Philadelphia and Chicago in the areas of homeless continuum of care development and implementation, development of plans to end homelessness and replication of the District of Columbia's model Community Care Grant Program. She has significant experience in providing technical assistance to nonprofit community based organizations in the areas of capacity building, organizational development and management and economic development. Sue also has an extensive history of public service, including 8 years as the Vice Chair of the District of Columbia Housing Finance Agency. She has served as Chief of Staff of the DC Department of Human Services, Mayor's Homeless Coordinator, and Staff Economist to the DC Council Committee on Finance and Revenue, Urban Policy Analyst for the Department of Housing and Urban Development and housing market analyst for the Urban Institute. She is currently a member of the District's Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH) and several nonprofit Boards.
