Dr. Sandra Jowers-Barber



Dr. Sandra Jowers-Barber is the Director of the Humanities Division and Associate Professor of History at the University of the District of Columbia Community College.

Dr. Sandra Jowers-Barber research interest focuses on documenting and interpreting the history of the African American deaf community. She speaks frequently on the importance of oral history in documenting the African American experience. Her chapter "The Struggle to Educate Black Deaf School Children in Washington, DC" in A Fair Chance in

the Race of Life: Gallaudet University's Role in Deaf History explores the struggle of African American deaf school age children for an education in the District. This anthology, published by Gallaudet University Press, celebrates 150 years of deaf education in Washington, D.C. "Educating Washington's Black Deaf Children in the Nineteenth Century." Her chapter, "The African-American Family: Giving the Gift of Roots and Wings" is included in the publication Family Affair: African American Identity in the 21st Century. Her biographical entry on the "The National Black Deaf Advocates" is found in the Encyclopedia of American Disability.

Dr. Jowers-Barber is serving a four year appointed term as a commissioner on the Mary McLeod Bethune Council House National Historic Site Advisory Commission, and is a member of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History, and the Association of Black Women Historians.

A Ward 4 resident, Dr. Jowers-Barber received a Bachelor of English, a Master of Public History and a PhD in United States History from Howard University.
