RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia Ken Grossinger Confirmation Resolution of 2018". Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia confirms the appointment of: Ken Grossinger 3025 N Street N.W. Washington, DC 20007 (Ward 2) as a member of the Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia, established by section 201 of the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Act, approved October 26, 1974 (88 Stat. 1424; Pub. L. 93-471; D.C. Official Code § 38-1202.01), replacing Errol Schwartz, for a term to end May 15, 2023. Sec. 3. Ken Grossinger



Ken Grossinger is a principal at Democracy Partners (DP), a strategic consulting firm where he directs the Impact Philanthropy and Donor Advising Division. Mr. Grossinger works with institutional and individual donors and advocacy organizations to maximize the strategic use of their resources to advance policy and program priorities.

In addition to serving as a principal at DP, Mr. Grossinger is Co-Founder and Chair of the CrossCurrents Foundation and its sister affiliate in London, CrossCurrents-UK. The funding portfolios of both foundations

focus on non-partisan civic engagement, civil liberties, human rights and the arts. Prior to entering the world of philanthropy, for two decades Mr. Grossinger was one of the labor movement's leading strategists. He represented public and private sector workers at Service Employees International Union for ten years, and for the next decade he directed legislative field operations for the AFL-CIO. Formerly a community organizer, Mr. Grossinger co-launched the Human SERVE Fund, a national advocate organization that initiated and led the successful fight for passage of the National Voter Registration Act, commonly known as Motor Voter.

Mr. Grossinger is active on several governing boards including the Alliance for Justice (Chair), Washington DC Housing Authority Board of Commissioners (formerly Vice-Chair), the Environmental Grantmakers Association, and the Grantmakers in the Arts. He is also on the advisory board of the NY New School for Social Research Center for Art and Politics.

A Ward 1 resident, Mr. Grossinger received his Bachelor of Science in Psychology and Philosophy from State University of New York (S.U.N.Y.) Brockport and his Master of Social Work from the Columbia University School of Social Work.
