

In this role, Dr. Burns provided nutrition policy guidance on a range of Administration initiatives and helped oversee ten Let's Move! programs across Federal agencies. In her current role with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Dr. Burns develops and implements Agency political strategy and policy communications on a variety of public health topics. She has also served on the faculty for the George Washington University Milken Institute for Public Health and was formerly a Study Director on the Food and Nutrition Board with the National Academy of Medicine.
