Dear Chairman Mendelson:

Enclosed for consideration by the Council is the "Streetscape Business Development Relief Expansion Emergency Amendment Act of 2020," the "Streetscape Business Development Relief Expansion Temporary Amendment Act of 2020," and the "Streetscape Business Development Relief Expansion Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020." This legislation will allow Main Streets Program organizations to be recipients of funds available in the Streetscape Business Development Relief Fund. Emergency legislation is necessary to ensure that businesses currently affected by development projects in their neighborhoods are able to receive funds as soon as possible.

The District's 24 independent, nonprofit neighborhood Main Street programs revitalize communities by retaining and recruiting businesses, improving commercial properties and streetscapes, and attracting consumers. Leaders in these neighborhood organizations assist businesses and coordinate sustainable community-driven revitalization efforts in their neighborhoods.

The Streetscape Fund currently only provides financial relief, in the form of interest-free loans and grants, directly to local for-profit businesses impacted by adjoining District streetscape construction, capital infrastructure, or rehabilitation projects. Including Main Streets non-profit programs as eligible Streetscape Fund recipients would afford them the ability to then receive grants and disburse Streetscape funds for eligible for-profit businesses thereby streamlining the process by which Main Streets distressed businesses can quickly receive much-needed assistance.

I urge the Council to take prompt and favorable action on the enclosed legislation.

(a) Main Streets non-profits provide critical services and overall support to 22 hundreds of small and local businesses located along the District's twenty-four Main Streets 23 corridors. 24 (b) Currently, twenty-one (21) businesses along the Rhode Island Ave. Main Street 25 (RIAMS) corridor, and twenty-two (22) businesses along the North Capital Main Street (NCMS) 26 corridor are being adversely impacted by DC Water's Northeast Boundary Tunnel (NEBT) 27 Project construction. 28 (c) To lessen the impact on these businesses, RIAMS has been providing emergency 29 financial relief to distressed small and local businesses, some of which are at risk of closing.

(d) Although a crucial partner to small and local businesses negatively affected by
streetscape projects, Main Streets are currently not eligible to receive funding through the
Streetscape Business Development Relief Fund ("the Fund") to better assist businesses along
their corridors.

- (e) Including Main Streets non-profit programs as eligible Fund recipients would afford the Main Streets the ability to then receive grants and disburse Streetscape funds to multiple, eligible for-profit businesses along their corridor affected by a single streetscape project.
- (f) Legislation is needed in order to immediately assist RIAMS by providing financial assistance to them with monies in the Fund so that they then have the critical funding to continue to act as an immediate resource for all the businesses negatively impacted by the NEBT Tunnel Project on Rhode Island Ave.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Streetscape Business Development Relief Expansion Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
