1 Councilmember Trayon White, Sr. 2 3 4 5 6 A BILL 7 8 9 10 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA 11 12 To declare the existence of an emergency with evictions prohibition during a declared public 13 14 health emergency and 60 days after the conclusion of the public health emergency. 15 16 RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this 17 resolution may be cited as the "Eviction Prohibition During Declared Public Health Crisis 18 Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020". 19 Sec. 2. (a) On March 11, 2020, the Mayor of the District of Columbia issued Mayor's 25 20 Order 2020-45 and 2020-46, declaring a public emergency and a public health emergency in the 21 District due to the imminent threat to the health, safety, and welfare of District residents posed 22 by the spread of COVID-19. That order is currently in effect through May 15, 2020. 23 (b) Residents will continue to be effected after the declared crisis and need time to 24 recover. From March 13, 2020 to April 21, 2020, 81,942 people filed for unemployment. Many 25 have reported difficulty completing the process. Although, financial help is available it may not 26 be readily accessible and effecting residents' ability to provide for their financial needs including 27 rent. Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances 28 29 enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the D.C. 30 Foreclosure Prohibition During Declared Public Health Crisis Emergency Act of 2020 to be 31 adopted after a single reading.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
