Aug (II) 1 2 3 4 5 Councilmember Elissa Silverman 6 7 8 9 A PROPOSED RESOLUTION 10 11 12 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA 13 14 15 16 To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to 17 the need to require employers to adopt and implement social distancing policies 18 that adheres to Mayor's Order 2020-080 or subsequent Mayor's Order, to prohibit 19 retaliation against an employee who refuses to work with or serve an individual 20 who refuses to comply with Mayor's Order 2020-080, to prohibit retaliation 21 against employees for other reasons, to authorize the Mayor and Attorney General 22 to administer and enforce workplace and employee protections in title I, to authorize the Attorney General to bring civil actions in a court of competent 23 24 jurisdiction, to authorize the Chief Procurement Officer to enter into an indefinite 25 duration/indefinite quantity contract to assist eligible businesses in the purchase of 26 personal protective equipment and other supplies related to the containment of 27 COVID-19, to permit federal laws, polices, and standards or a Mayor's Order that 28 contains stricter personal protective equipment standards, to preempt the terms of 29 title I; and to amend the Small and Certified Business Enterprise Act of 2005 to 30 authorize the Mayor to issue grants for small businesses to purchase or receive 31 reimbursements for the purchase of personal protective equipment for their 32 employees. 33 34 RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That 35 this resolution may be cited as the "Protecting Businesses and Workers from COVID-19 36 Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2021". 37 Sec. 2. (a) On July 28, 2020, the Council passed the Protecting Businesses and 38 Workers from COVID-19 Emergency Amendment Act of 2020, effective August 13, 39 2020 (D.C. Act 23-384; 67 DCR 9870) ("emergency Act"). The corresponding Protecting 40 Businesses and Workers from COVID-19 Congressional Review Emergency Amendment

- 1 Act of 2020 (D.C. Act 23-483; 67 DCR 13860) is set to expire on February 13, 2021. The
- 2 emergency Act created important COVID-19-related workers' rights, protections against
- 3 retaliation if they act to protect their safety and health, and enforcement mechanisms; and
- 4 the Act authorized additional resources for businesses to purchase personal protective
- 5 equipment during the COVID-19 public health emergency.
- 6 (b) On September 22, 2020, the Council passed the Protecting Businesses and
- Workers from COVID-19 Temporary Amendment Act of 2020, passed on 2nd reading on
- 8 September 22, 2020 (Enrolled version of Bill 23-871). It was transmitted to Congress on
- 9 November 5, 2020, and is currently under congressional review.
- 10 (c) In order to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency
- 11 Act and the effective date of the temporary legislation, it is necessary to approve
- 12 congressional review emergency legislation.
- Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances
- enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the
- 15 Protecting Businesses and Workers from COVID-19 Congressional Review Emergency
- Amendment Act of 2020 be adopted after a single reading.
- 17 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
