

Chairman Phil Mendelson A PROPOSED RESOLUTION IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To reappoint of Ms. Meridel Bulle-Vu as a member of the Child Support Guideline Commission. RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA. That this resolution may be cited as the "Child Support Guideline Commission Meridel Bulle-Vu Reappointment Resolution of 2023". Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia reappoints: Ms. Meridel Bulle-Vu Military Road, N.W. Washington, D.C. 20015 (Ward 3) as a member of the Child Support Guideline Commission, established by section 3 of the Child Support Guideline Amendment Act of 1990, effective July 25, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-150; D.C. Official Code § 16-916.02), to serve a 4-year term to end December 20, 2026. Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the appointee, to the chairperson of the Child Support Guideline Commission, and to the Office of the Mayor.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

court, and stakeholders, drafting and revising proposed legislation, and commenting on federal regulations. Manage and
oversee three grants and ensure grant compliance. Hire, onboard, train, and evaluate staff and ensure their continued
professional development. Lead internal and external trainings and outreach on the substance and practice of family
law. Mentor pro bono attorneys in family law. Provide technical assistance to other practitioners across D.C.
