From March 2014 through the end of the Obama Administration, Dr. Elam served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Planning and

Evaluation directing the office of Disability, Aging and Long-Term Care Policy (DALTCP) at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). The Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation (ASPE) develops and reviews policy on behalf of the Secretary of HHS, and its unique role is to provide cross cutting policy perspectives and empirical analyses that span HHS and Administration programs, public and private sector activities, and the research and practice communities. Through her work at DALTCP, Dr. Elam provided leadership on HHS policies that support the independence, health and productivity of elderly individuals and people with disabilities, including issues related to integrated care, rehabilitative services, mental health parity, post-acute and long-term care, employment of people with disabilities, and the direct care workforce. Prior to her appointment to ASPE, Dr. Elam was Senior Deputy Director and State Medicaid Director at the District of Columbia's Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF). As Medicaid Director, Dr. Elam oversaw the offices responsible for program operations, policy and research, health care delivery management, health reform and innovation, long term care, and the Office of the Medical Director. Previously, Dr. Elam served as the Director of the Health Care Policy and Planning Administration within DHCF and she served as agency Interim Director during the 2011 mayoral transition. During her time at DHCF, Dr. Elam was responsible for leading critical programmatic changes related to the Affordable Care Act, including Medicaid expansion and the initial work that established the District's health benefits exchange. In addition, she spearheaded Medicaid long-term care reform activities designed to both right-size the program and improve the quality of benefits delivered to eligible residents.

A Ward 5 resident, Ms. Elam earned her Bachelor of Science in Zoology from Howard University, her Master of Public Health from the University of California at Berkeley, and her PhD in Health Policy and Management from Johns Hopkins University.
