Dr. Luis W. Dominguez



Dr. Luis W. Dominguez, MD, MPH, is a DC-based healthcare professional with significant experience in the medical field and in health policy. As a medical student, Dr. Dominguez had a keen interest in how health played out, not just in the exam room, but population-wide. His advocacy role took shape during his residency, when he was elected to negotiate the employment contracts between the residents and the hospital. Dr. Dominguez also sat on the graduate medical education committee, helping to reform both our discharge process and outpatient rotations.

Upon graduation, Dr. Dominguez knew he wanted to continue advocating for a better healthcare system, so he enrolled in the Health Policy Fellowship at The George Washington University. While there, he worked for the Healthcare Subcommittee of Energy and Commerce, in the US House. He developed significant expertise in drug research, development, & pricing, Medicaid, health economics, and CMS regulations.

Dr. Dominguez was then hired by GW Medical School to direct a longitudinal course called Patients, Populations & Systems. He teaches about the social, political, and economic drivers of health, along with how the American healthcare system works and is organized. He was elected to the Medical Informatics Committee of the American College of Physicians, and currently serves as the informatics lead for his division within GW's Community Primary Care division.

Dr. Dominguez has published on drug pricing, the social determinants of health, the need to realign incentives for prevention and primary care, and the importance of Medicaid in addressing access and equity. His interests lie in healthcare and insurance reform, drug pricing, and extending access to the underserved.

A Ward 7 resident, Dr. Dominguez earned his Bachelor of Arts in Psychological and Brain Sciences from Dartmouth College and his Medical Degree and Master of Public Health from St. George's University.
