County, Maryland. He served as the Executive Director, National Association of County Engineers from October 1993 through June 2011.

Mr. Giancola is a life member of the American Public Works Association (APWA). He served as President of the VA/DC/MD Chapter in 1996, President of the Institute of Transportation in 1995, and the APWA representative on the National Quality Initiative Steering Committee from 1993 to 1995.
