9	(b) An elder and vulnerable adult abuse fatality review
10	team may be initiated by any of the following agencies, which
11	shall specify the geographic area which the team shall serve:
12	1. A state attorney, or his or her designee.
13	2. A law enforcement agency.
14	3. The Department of Children and Families.
15	4. The Office of the Attorney General.
16	5. The Agency for Persons with Disabilities.
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17	(c) The purpose of a review team is to learn how to
18	prevent elder and vulnerable adult abuse and abuse-related
19	deaths by intervening early and improving the system response to
20	elder and vulnerable adult abuse, exploitation, or neglect.
21	(2) For purposes of this section and s. 415.1104, the term
22	"vulnerable adult" includes a disabled adult and elderly person
23	as those terms are defined in s. 825.101(3) and (4),
24	respectively.
25	<u>(3)(a)</u> An elder abuse fatality <u>A</u> review team <u>must</u> may
26	include a representative from the entity initating the team, who
27	shall actively participate.
28	(b) A review team may include, but is not limited to,
29	representatives from the other entities which may initiate the
30	team under paragraph (b) of subsection (1) and any of the
31	following entities or persons located in the review team's
32	judicial circuit:
33	1. Law enforcement agencies.
34	2. The state attorney.
35	<u>1.</u> The medical examiner.

66	Members of a review team shall serve without compensation and
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67 may not be reimbursed for per diem or travel expenses. Members
68 shall serve for terms of 2 years, to be staggered as determined
69 by the co-chairs.

70 (d) The state attorney may call the first organizational 71 meeting of the team. At the initial meeting, members of a review 72 team shall choose two members to serve as co-chairs. Chairs may 73 be reelected by a majority vote of a review team for not more 74 than two consecutive terms. At the initial meeting, members of a 75 review team shall establish a schedule for future meetings. Each 76 review team shall meet at least once each fiscal year.

77 (c) Each review team shall determine its local operations, 78 including, but not limited to, the process for case selection. 79 The state attorney shall refer cases to be reviewed by each 80 team. Reviews must be limited to closed cases in which an 81 elderly person's death was caused by, or related to, abuse or 82 neglect. All identifying information concerning the elderly 83 person must be redacted by the state attorney in documents received for review. As used in this paragraph, the term "closed 84 85 case" means a case that does not involve information considered active as defined in s. 119.011(3)(d). 86

87 (b) The review team may determine the number and type of
 88 incidents it chooses to review.

89 90 <u>(c)</u> (f) Administrative costs of operating the review team must be borne by the team members or entities they represent.

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91 <u>(5) (2)</u> <u>A</u> An elder abuse fatality review team in existence 92 on <u>July 1, 2023</u> July 1, 2020, may continue to exist and must 93 comply with the requirements of this section.

94 <u>(6)(3)</u> <u>A</u> An elder abuse fatality review team <u>must</u> shall do 95 all of the following:

96 (a) Review <u>fatal and near-fatal incidents involving deaths</u>
97 of elderly persons <u>and vulnerable adults in the team's</u>
98 <u>jurisdiction</u> in its judicial circuit which are found to have
99 been caused by, or related to, abuse, <u>exploitation</u>, or neglect.

(b) Take into consideration the events leading up to a fatal <u>or near-fatal</u> incident, available community resources, current law and policies, and the actions taken by systems or individuals related to the fatal <u>or near-fatal</u> incident, <u>and any</u> <u>information considered relevant by the team, including a review</u> <u>of public records and records for which a public records</u> <u>exemption is granted</u>.

107 (c) Identify potential gaps, deficiencies, or problems in
108 the delivery of services to elderly persons <u>or vulnerable adults</u>
109 by public and private agencies which may be related to <u>incidents</u>

(d) Whenever possible, develop communitywide approaches to address the causes of, and contributing factors to, <u>incidents</u> deaths reviewed by the team.
