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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Section 1003.457, Florida Statutes, is created
17	to read:
18	1003.457 Instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and
19	use of automated external defibrillator
20	(1) Each school district shall provide instruction in
21	cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of an automated
22	external defibrillator to students in grades 9 through 12 within
23	its health or physical education curriculum. The instruction
24	shall:
25	(a) Include training in the psychomotor skills necessary
26	to perform CPR and to use an automated external defibrillator.
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27	As used in this section, "psychomotor skills" means skills
28	learned through hands-on practice that supports cognitive
29	learning.
30	(b) Be based upon an instructional program developed by:
31	1. The American Heart Association;
32	2. The American Red Cross; or
33	3. Another nationally recognized program that is based
34	upon the most current national evidence-based emergency
35	cardiovascular care guidelines for CPR and the use of an
36	automated external defibrillator.
37	(2) Instructional personnel may facilitate, provide, or
38	oversee instruction in CPR and the use of an automated external
39	defibrillator. However, if a school district offers a course
40	that results in CPR and automated external defibrillator
41	certification, the course must be taught by an instructor
42	authorized to conduct an instructional program described in
43	paragraph (1)(b).
44	(3) This section does not require a student to become
45	certified to administer CPR or to use an automated external
46	defibrillator.
47	Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 1003.453, Florida
48	Statutes, is amended to read:
49	1003.453 School wellness and physical education policies;
50	nutrition guidelines
51	(3) School districts are encouraged to provide basic
52	training in first aid, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation,
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53	for all students, beginning in grade 6 and every 2 years
54	thereafter. For students in grades 6 and 8, this should include
55	training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Private and public
56	partnerships for providing training or necessary funding are
57	encouraged.
58	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
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
