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injury or posttraumatic stress disorder. For purposes of this section, the term "alternative treatment" means a therapeutic service that is not part of the standard of medical care established by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for treating traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic stress disorder but has been shown by at least one scientific or medical peer-reviewed study to have some positive effect on traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic stress disorder.

Alternative treatment must be provided under the direction and supervision of an individual licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 460, chapter 464, chapter 490, or chapter 491.

(2) Each contracted individual or entity shall report annually to the department each alternative treatment provided, the number of veterans served, and the treatment outcomes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.

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
