(b) For a second violation, a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. In addition, the commission shall assess an administrative fine of \$9,500 per shark fin or ray part and suspend all of the person's license privileges under this chapter for 365 days.

(c) For a third and any subsequent violation, a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. In addition, the commission shall assess an administrative fine of <u>\$25,000 per shark fin or ray part</u> \$9,500 and permanently revoke all of the person's license privileges under this chapter.
