Section 2. Subsection (83) is added to section 320.08058, 17 Florida Statutes, to read: 18 19 320.08058 Specialty license plates.-20 (83) SUN, SEA, AND SMILES LICENSE PLATES.-21 (a) Notwithstanding s. 320.08053, the department shall 22 develop a Sun, Sea, and Smiles license plate as provided in this section. Sun, Sea, and Smiles license plates must bear the 23 24 colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" 25 must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Sun-Sea-26 Smiles" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

(b) The department shall retain all annual use fees from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, the license plate annual use fees shall be distributed as follows:

- 1. Five percent shall be distributed to Florida Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc., strictly for marketing of the Sun, Sea, and Smiles license plate.
- 2. Thirty percent shall be distributed to Florida

 Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc. Of this amount, up to 5

 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the remainder shall be used as follows:
- a. Sixty percent shall be used for a college scholarship program.
- <u>b.</u> Fifteen percent shall be used to promote health and wellness among Florida residents of Caribbean descent.
- c. Twenty-five percent shall be used to promote awareness of Caribbean culture within the state.
- 3. Twenty percent shall be distributed to The American Friends of Jamaica, Inc., a New York-based charitable, not-for-profit organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, for use as grants to promote social and community development among Florida residents. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative and marketing expenses.
- 4. Ten percent shall be distributed to Haitian
 Neighborhood Center Sant La, Inc., to promote social and

community development. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses.
