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- (2) A law enforcement agency may not use kinetic impact munitions or tear gas on an assembly or protest unless the assembly or protest has been declared to be unlawful or a declared state of emergency exists concerning such protest or assembly. As used in this subsection, the term "kinetic impact munitions" includes impact rounds and baton rounds, such as rubber batons, bean bag rounds, foam baton rounds, and plastic, wax, wood, or rubber-coated projectiles.
- (3) Equipment and munitions described in subsection (1) may not be used by a law enforcement agency without permission of the executive director of the Department of Law Enforcement.
- (4) This section does not apply to the Florida National Guard or Florida State Defense Force.
- (5) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.
