An act relating to osteopathic physician certification and licensure; amending s. 459.0055, F.S.; requiring the successful completion of an internship or residency for licensure or certification as an osteopathic physician; providing accreditation requirements for such internships and residencies; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (1) of subsection (1) of section 459.0055, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

459.0055 General licensure requirements.-

- Except as otherwise provided herein, any person desiring to be licensed or certified as an osteopathic physician pursuant to this chapter shall:
- Demonstrate that she or he has successfully completed an internship or residency a resident internship of not less than 12 months in a program accredited <del>hospital approved</del> for this purpose by the Board of Trustees of the American Osteopathic Association or the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education any other internship program approved by the board upon a showing of good cause by the applicant. This requirement may be waived for an applicant who matriculated in a

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college of osteopathic medicine during or before 1948; and
Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
