Section 295.156, Florida Statutes, is created 19 to read: 20 295.156 Alternative Treatment Options for Veterans Pilot 21 Program.-22 The Alternative Treatment Options for Veterans Pilot (1)23 Program is created within the Department of Veterans' Affairs. 24 The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall contract 25 with one or more individuals, corporations not for profit, state

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universities, or Florida College System institutions for a period of 2 years to provide alternative treatment options for veterans who have been certified by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or any branch of the United States Armed Forces as having a traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic stress disorder. For purposes of this section, the term "alternative treatment" means a therapeutic service that is not part of the standard of medical care established by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for treating traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic stress disorder but has been shown by at least one scientific or medical peer-reviewed study to have some positive effect on traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic stress disorder.

- (3) Alternative treatment under the pilot program must be provided under the direction and supervision of an individual licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 460, chapter 464, chapter 490, or chapter 491.
- (4) By January 1 of each year, each contracted individual or entity shall report to the department each alternative treatment provided under the pilot program, the number of veterans served, and the treatment outcomes. The department shall report such information to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by March 1 of each year.
 - (5) This section expires June 30, 2020.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.

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
