A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
 - (b) A person does not violate this subsection if he or she

- (2) Any person who makes, posts, or transmits a threat in a writing or other record, including an electronic record, to conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism, in any manner that would allow another person to view the threat when such threat is sufficient to cause a well-founded fear in a reasonable person that the threat will be acted upon, commits a felony of the third second degree, punishable as provided in s.
