36	tickets to be given away or resold, independent of and without

40	discriminated against, or denied access to an event solely on
41	the grounds that the ticket or tickets were resold or on the

44	(3) A person who knowingly violates this section is liable
45	for a civil penalty equal to treble the amount of all sales of
46	tickets subject to such violation.
