- 4. Has identified a qualified supervisor, as determined by rule of the board.
- (4)(a) The department shall issue a license by endorsement to an applicant who the board certifies has met all of the following requirements:
- 1. Has submitted a completed application and paid a nonrefundable application fee set by rule of the board.
- 2. Holds a professional art therapist license in good standing, or its equivalent, issued by another state or jurisdiction, if the qualifications for licensure in such other state or jurisdiction are equal to or greater than those specified in subsection (2).
- 3. Has demonstrated, in a manner designated by rule of the board, knowledge of the laws and rules governing the practice of clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, and professional art therapy.

art therapy in such other state or jurisdiction for 3 of the 5 years immediately preceding his or her application for licensure by endorsement under this subsection.

- 5. Is not under investigation for, and has not been found guilty of, any act that would constitute a violation of this chapter.
- (b) The department shall waive the requirements of subsection (2) and issue a professional art therapist license to an applicant who, before July 1, 2024, submits a completed application, pays a nonrefundable application fee set by rule of the board, and demonstrates to the board that he or she has met all of the following requirements:
- 1. Has passed the Art Therapy Credentials Board Examination offered by the Art Therapy Credentials Board, Inc., or an examination offered by any successor organization.
- 2. Has engaged in the practice of professional art therapy for at least 5 years, which may include up to 1 year of practice under supervision, as determined by rule of the board.
- 3. Has completed appropriate training, as determined by rule of the board, in the assessment, diagnosis, treatment, or resolution of mental, behavioral, and emotional disorders and dysfunctions as part of the approved course of study for his or her master's or doctoral degree or following completion of such degree.
  - 4. Has demonstrated, in a manner designated by rule of the

board, knowledge of the laws and rules governing the practice of clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, mental health counseling, and professional art therapy.

- 5. Is not under investigation for, and has not been found guilty of, any act that would constitute a violation of this chapter.
- (5)(a) The board or department shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the annual renewal of professional art therapist licenses at a fee set by rule of the board.
- (b)1. An applicant for license renewal shall present satisfactory evidence that, in the period since the license was issued, the applicant has completed continuing education requirements, as determined by rule of the board or department.
- 2. The board or department shall require continuing education which must include, at a minimum, the continuing education requirements for maintaining national board certification in good standing with the Art Therapy Credentials Boards, Inc., or any successor organization. The board or department may not require more than 100 hours of continuing education in a 5-year period.
- (c) Continuing education providers, programs, and courses, and laws and rules governing such providers, programs, and courses, must be approved by the board or department as specified in s. 491.0085.
  - (d) The board or department shall adopt rules establishing

- (6)(a) Inactive status is the licensure status that results when a licensee has applied to the department to be placed on inactive status <u>and has paid a nonrefundable fee set</u> by rule of the board.
- (b) An inactive license may be renewed annually <u>by paying</u> a nonrefundable fee set by rule of the board.
- (c) An inactive license may be reactivated by submitting a completed application to the department <u>and paying a</u> nonrefundable fee set by rule of the board.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 343 or other similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
