

1 A bill to be entitled
 2 An act relating to the emergency opioid antagonists in
 3 public K-12 schools and postsecondary educational
 4 institutions; amending s. 1002.20, F.S.; authorizing
 5 public schools to purchase, use, and maintain a supply
 6 of emergency opioid antagonists that meet specified
 7 criteria, rather than only naloxone; amending s.
 8 1004.0971, F.S.; revising the definition of the term
 9 "emergency opioid antagonist"; providing an effective
 10 date.

 12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 14 **Section 1. Paragraph (o) of subsection (3) of section**
 15 **1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:**

16 1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.—Parents of public
 17 school students must receive accurate and timely information
 18 regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed
 19 of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12
 20 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory
 21 rights including, but not limited to, the following:

- 22 (3) HEALTH ISSUES.—
 23 (o) Emergency opioid antagonist ~~Naloxone~~ use and supply.—
 24 1. A public school may purchase a supply of a United
 25 States Food and Drug Administration-approved emergency ~~the~~

26 | opioid antagonist ~~naloxone~~ from a wholesale distributor as
27 | defined in s. 499.003 or may enter into an arrangement with a
28 | wholesale distributor or manufacturer as defined in s. 499.003
29 | for such emergency opioid antagonist ~~naloxone~~ at fair-market,
30 | free, or reduced prices for use in the event that a student has
31 | an opioid overdose. The emergency opioid antagonist ~~naloxone~~
32 | must be maintained in a secure location on the public school's
33 | premises.

34 | 2. A school district employee who administers an approved
35 | emergency opioid antagonist to a student in compliance with ss.
36 | 381.887 and 768.13 is immune from civil liability under s.
37 | 768.13.

38 | **Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section**
39 | **1004.0971, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:**

40 | 1004.0971 Emergency opioid antagonists in Florida College
41 | System institution and state university housing.—

42 | (1) As used in this section, the term:

43 | (b) "Emergency opioid antagonist" means a ~~naloxone~~
44 | ~~hydrochloride or any similarly acting~~ drug that blocks the
45 | effects of opioids administered from outside the body and that
46 | is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration
47 | for the emergency treatment of an opioid overdose.

48 | **Section 3.** This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
