A state attorney may also file a petition 40 41 seeking relief under this section in the county court of the 42 county in which the animal is found within 10 days after the 43 animal is seized or an order to provide care is issued. The court shall schedule and commence a hearing on the petition 44 45 within 30 days after the petition is filed to determine whether the owner, if known, is able to provide adequately for the 46 47 animal and is fit to have custody of the animal. The hearing shall be concluded and the court order entered thereon within 60 48 49 days after the date the hearing is commenced. The timeframes set 50 forth in this subsection are not jurisdictional. However, if a 51 failure to meet such timeframes is attributable to the officer, 52 state attorney, or agent, the owner is not required to pay the Page 2 of 37

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53 officer or agent for care of the animal during any period of 54 delay caused by the officer or agent. A fee may not be charged 55 for filing the petition. This subsection does not require court 56 action for the taking into custody and making proper disposition 57 of stray or abandoned animals as lawfully performed by animal 58 control agents.

59 The officer, state attorney, or agent of any county or (3) 60 of any society or association for the prevention of cruelty to 61 animals filing a petition taking charge of any animal pursuant to the provisions of this section shall have written notice 62 63 served, at least 3 days before the hearing scheduled under subsection (2), upon the owner of the animal, if he or she is 64 known and is residing in the county where the animal was taken, 65 in conformance with the provisions of chapter 48 relating to 66 67 service of process. The sheriff of the county shall not charge a fee for service of such notice. 68

69 (5) In determining the person's fitness to have custody of 70 an animal under the provisions of this section act, the court 71 may consider, among other matters:

(a) Testimony from the agent or officer who seized the animal, a state attorney, and other witnesses as to the condition of the animal when seized and as to the conditions under which the animal was kept.
