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because of a government closure or shutdown, the state will assist those employees during the closure or shutdown and upon the reopening of the government.

- (3) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section, the term:
- (a) "Department" means the Department of Economic Opportunity.
- (b) "Government employee" or "employee" means any person employed by a local, state, or federal government agency or entity.
 - (4) EMERGENCY MORATORIUM.—

- (a) In the event of a local, state, or federal government closure or shutdown, the agency or entity that is closed or shut down shall notify, in writing, all affected government employees. Upon notification, an affected government employee may contact the department and request, in writing, assistance from the department.
- (b) The department shall, upon verification that the affected government employee is furloughed, provide such employee a Letter to Creditors, which the employee must mail to his or her creditors individually, requesting certain creditors, including, but not limited to, utility companies, landlords, and mortgage companies, to comply with the State of Florida

 Emergency Moratorium on Repayment of Debts for Furloughed

 Employees Act by stopping all collection of debts owed by the affected government employee. The moratorium shall last no

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longer than 6 months after the mailing date of the Letter to
Creditors.

- (c) Any creditor that receives a Letter to Creditors may not adversely report the government employee to a collection agency or credit reporting bureau. A government employee's credit worthiness may not be affected during the time the employee is furloughed.
- (d) Upon the reopening of the government agency or entity, or the expiration of the 6-month period, whichever is sooner, the moratorium is lifted and credit reporting may resume. The affected government employee may request assistance from the department to create a repayment plan unless the state decides to pay, cancel, or suspend any or all of the employee's debt.
- (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this section.
- (6) This section applies to government employees furloughed on or after December 22, 2018.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
