51 "Your mammogram shows that your breast tissue is dense. 52 Dense breast tissue is relatively common and is found in 53 approximately 50 percent of women. The presence of dense breast 54 tissue can make it more difficult to detect some abnormalities 55 in the breast and may also be associated with an increased risk 56 of breast cancer. This information about the results of your 57 mammogram is given to you to raise your awareness. A report of 58 your results was sent to your health care provider. Further 59 recommendations may be added at the discretion of the 60 interpreting radiologist. Please be aware that additional screening studies may not be covered by your insurance." 61 62 63 (1) This section does not create a duty, standard of care, 64 or other legal obligation beyond the duty to provide notice as 65 set forth in this section. (2) 66 This section does not require a notice that is 67 inconsistent with the federal Mammography Quality Standards Act 68 or any regulation promulgated pursuant to that act. 69 This section is repealed June 30, 2023.
