The 22 Legislature further finds that the state will benefit from the 23 further engagement of community members as unpaid auxiliary law 24 enforcement officers who can support multiple jurisdictions to enhance, among other things, the exchange and collection of 25

intelligence information, thereby benefitting statewide law
enforcement efforts.

- (b) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the department shall create a program to appoint and supervise unpaid auxiliary law enforcement officers with statewide jurisdiction to support law enforcement agencies throughout the state. An auxiliary law enforcement officer appointed under this paragraph shall not be considered as holding an office under the government of the state or the counties and municipalities therein as a result of the appointment.
- (18) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, non-high-liability law enforcement officer training courses of eight or fewer students taught using a virtual classroom may be conducted from any location without a commission-certified instructor present in the classroom.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
