House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, requesting Congress to pass the National Infrastructure Bank Act to finance urgently needed infrastructure projects.

WHEREAS, the American Society of Civil Engineers gave the United States a grade of C- in its 2021 Report Card for America's Infrastructure and projected that more than \$6.1 trillion would be needed through 2029 to restore the nation's infrastructure to a state of good repair, yet less than half of that amount is currently funded and the remainder is inadequately funded, and

WHEREAS, new 21st century projects are also unfunded, and WHEREAS, 13 percent of Florida's roads are in poor condition, costing drivers in Florida roughly \$425 per year to drive in the state, and 15 percent of Florida's bridges are at least 50 years old and 2.9 percent are rated structurally deficient, and

WHEREAS, Florida has serious water infrastructure issues, and the state's drinking water needs total an estimated \$21.9 billion, wastewater needs are estimated to total \$18.4 billion, and stormwater management needs are estimated to be \$1.1 billion, and

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WHEREAS, the National Low Income Housing Coalition reports a shortage of 411,846 affordable rental homes available for extremely low-income renters, and Florida International University in its reports titled "Miami's Housing Affordability Crisis" has documented that 6 in 10 employed adult residents of Greater Miami spend more than 30 percent of their incomes on housing, which is the highest rate of any large metro area in the nation, and

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would require no new federal spending and no new federal taxes and would be capitalized by repurposing existing Treasury debt, as was done previously in this country's history, and

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would help finance Florida's infrastructure in partnership with the state, county, and other local governments, and

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would build infrastructure, create jobs in rural and urban communities, end poverty, bring broadband connectivity into every corner of the state regardless of cost, fix all roads not covered by Congress, and would finance new rail lines, including high-speed rail, connecting Florida both north-south and east-west to the southeast and beyond, an

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would further develop Florida's ports, build 7 million affordable housing units in the nation, including in Florida, and hire and train

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people who lost their jobs during the COVID-19 pandemic and employ them in high-paying jobs to build necessary infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank is modeled on previous banks that helped build much of this nation's infrastructure under Presidents George Washington, James Madison, Abraham Lincoln, and Franklin D. Roosevelt, the last president who helped bring this country out of the Depression and win World War II, and

WHEREAS, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would create 25 million new jobs, mandate large-scale minority hiring, pay Davis-Bacon wages, include Buy American provisions, and provide disadvantaged business enterprises with significant disbursements, and

WHEREAS, according to experts, the National Infrastructure Bank Act would grow the economy by 5 percent per year as did its predecessors, and

WHEREAS, in Florida, several county and city councils and planning organizations have come out in favor of the National Infrastructure Bank Act, including the Alachua Board of County Commissioners, the Gainesville City Commission, the Northern Central Florida Regional Planning Council, and the Miami-Dade Counties Transportation Planning Organization, and

WHEREAS, national organizations have also passed resolutions endorsing the National Infrastructure Bank Act,

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including the Public Banking Institute, the National Congress of Black Women, the National Association of Counties, the US High Speed Rail Association, the National Latino Farmers and Ranchers, the American Sustainable Business Council, the National Association of Minority Contractors, the National Federation of Federal Employees, as well as many community and labor organizations, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the United States Congress is requested to pass the National Infrastructure Bank Act, creating a National Infrastructure Bank to finance urgently needed infrastructure projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be presented to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
