- 1. Domestic violence, as defined in s. 741.28; or
- 2. Dating violence, as defined in s. 784.046(1)(d).
- (2)(a) Beginning January 1, 2023, the department shall post a publicly accessible domestic abuser registry on its website that includes each person convicted of a domestic abuse offense on or after that date.
- (b)1. The registry must include a photograph of the abuser taken as part of the booking process, the abuser's full legal name, and any other identifying information the department determines is necessary to properly identify the abuser and to exclude innocent persons.
- 2. The registry may not include the abuser's social security number, driver license number, or any other state or federal identification number.
- (c) The clerk of the court in each county shall forward a copy of the judgment and date of birth of each abuser to the department within 30 calendar days after the date of conviction of the abuser.
- (d)1. Upon an abuser's third conviction, the department shall maintain the abuser's full legal name and other identifying information described in paragraph (b) on the registry for 2 years after the date of the abuser's third conviction, after which time the department shall remove the abuser's full legal name and identifying information from the

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registry if the abuser is not convicted of another domestic abuse offense during that 2-year period.

- 2. Upon an abuser's subsequent conviction, the department shall maintain the abuser's full legal name and other identifying information described in paragraph (b) on the registry for 5 years after the date of the abuser's most recent conviction, after which time the department shall remove the abuser's full legal name and identifying information from the registry if the abuser is not convicted of another domestic abuse offense during that 5-year period.
- (e) The department shall remove an abuser's full legal name and identifying information from the registry if the record of the domestic abuse offense for which the abuser is subject to inclusion in the registry is expunged or sealed pursuant to this chapter.
