Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that petitions filed under ss. 741.30 and 741.301, Florida Statutes, and all records and documents related to the petitions be made confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution unless the domestic violence petition was granted. Persons who have been accused of domestic violence face barriers to employment and other life opportunities and knowledge that they were so accused, although no injunction was granted, would expose them to possible discrimination and public obloquy. It is necessary that these petitions and related documents be made confidential in order for such petitioners to have the chance to continue their lives without such consequences when no injunction was ever issued.

Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 841 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
