34	(2) PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.—
35	(a) The department, in coordination with the board, shall
36	establish and administer the At-home Drug Deactivation and
37	Disposal System Program for the purpose of identifying and
38	distributing to pharmacies an at-home drug deactivation and
39	disposal system that is suitable for the safe disposal of opioid
40	drugs prescribed for the treatment of acute pain pursuant to s.
41	456.44(5). The at-home drug deactivation and disposal system
42	must be capable of permanently rendering the active
43	pharmaceutical ingredient in such prescriptions nonretrievable,
44	nonusable, and environmentally safe for disposal. Pharmacies
45	must co-dispense the at-home drug deactivation and disposal
46	system with each opioid prescription dispensed for the treatment
47	of acute pain pursuant to s. 456.44(5).
