Section 1. Subsection (28) of section 403.703, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

403.703 Definitions.—As used in this part, the term:

(28) "Recovered materials" means metal, paper, glass, plastic, textile, or rubber, wood, asphalt, or concrete materials that have known recycling potential, can be feasibly recycled, and have been diverted and source separated or have been removed from the solid waste stream for sale, use, or reuse as raw materials, whether or not the materials require subsequent processing or separation from each other, but the term does not include materials destined for any use that constitutes disposal. Recovered materials as described in this subsection are not solid waste. For purposes of this subsection, the term "wood" does not include wood treated or coated with chemicals to resist decomposition or vegetative matter resulting from landscaping maintenance or land clearing operations that
