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1 A bill to be entitled

An act relating to public school educational assessments and accountability; suspending the use of statewide, standardized assessment results for purposes of student promotion, retention, or graduation and evaluation of instructional personnel and school administrators for specific school years; providing requirements for determining the promotion or retention of a grade 3 student; requiring a grade 10 student to earn a concordant score to meet a specific graduation requirement; suspending school grades for specific school years; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt and implement a new school grading system by a specified date; providing requirements for the new school grading system; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law:

(1) For the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, results
from the statewide, standardized assessments in English Language
Arts (ELA) and Mathematics administered pursuant to s. 1008.22,
Florida Statutes, may not be used to determine the promotion or
retention of a student, to satisfy graduation requirements to
earn a standard high school diploma, or as evaluation criteria

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for the annual evaluation of instructional personnel and school administrators. Determination of promotion or retention for a grade 3 student shall be made using the student's academic performance and report card and other evidence that demonstrates the student's mastery of Florida's academic standards for ELA. To satisfy the graduation requirement that a student pass the grade 10 ELA assessment, a grade 10 student must earn the appropriate concordant score on the SAT or ACT as determined by the Commissioner of Education pursuant to s. 1008.22, Florida Statutes.

- (2) For the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, school grades, pursuant to s. 1008.34, Florida Statutes, shall be held in abeyance. Performance on the statewide, standardized assessments administered pursuant to s. 1008.22, Florida

 Statutes, shall serve as an informational baseline for schools to work toward improved performance in future years. A school may not be required to select and implement a turnaround option pursuant to s. 1008.33, Florida Statutes, in the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 school years.
- (3) No later than July 1, 2017, the State Board of Education shall adopt and implement a school grading system that is demonstrably equitable, reliable, timely, rigorous, affordable, and rationally funded. The state board must include components representing the state's academic standards, classroom instruction, technology, and assessments in the new school grading system.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.

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
