An act relating to health planning and

An act relating to health planning and data; requiring the Department of Health to issue certain daily reports on its website; providing requirements for the reports; providing that the reports are public records; providing construction; amending s. 408.033, F.S., as amended, relating to local health councils; providing an effective date.

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WHEREAS, COVID-19 is an infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, which since first identified in late 2019, has infected millions of people around the world, and

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WHEREAS, COVID-19 has caused or contributed to the deaths of hundreds of thousands of people in the United States, including tens of thousands of Floridians, and

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WHEREAS, the Department of Health is one of the agencies essential to the state's efforts to keep residents and visitors safe from COVID-19, and

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WHEREAS, duties of the Department of Health include, but are not limited to, monitoring, coordinating, and administering COVID-19 testing and vaccinations; compiling testing results, vaccination data, and demographic information; and providing the public with daily updates of such testing, vaccination, and demographic data, along with any other statistical information

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related to COVID-19, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health has partnered with certain entities, including counties, to facilitate, advance, and expand the reach of testing and vaccination efforts across this state, and

WHEREAS, it is critical that certain demographic information related to COVID-19 testing and vaccination be measured and released at the county level, and

WHEREAS, providing such information at the county level will allow a more effective assessment of where to establish testing and vaccination sites, will enable the identification of areas requiring an enhanced presence of testing or vaccination sites based on aggregate data, and will ensure that testing and vaccination sites are located in the areas of greatest need and demand, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. COVID-19 daily data reporting.-

- (1) The Department of Health shall issue daily reports on its website which include, at a minimum, aggregate testing and vaccination data at the county level in one chart, including the birth year, sex, race, ethnicity, and county of each individual who is tested or vaccinated.
 - (2) The reports under subsection (1) are public records

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subject to s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and shall be made available upon request in accordance with that section.

- (3) This section does not authorize the release or publication of personal identifying information, biometric identification information, or other personal health information protected under state or federal law.
- Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 408.033, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 8 of chapter 2019-136, Laws of Florida, is amended to read:
 - 408.033 Local and state health planning.-
 - (1) LOCAL HEALTH COUNCILS.-

- (b) Each local health council may:
- 1. Develop a district area health plan that permits each local health council to develop strategies and set priorities for implementation based on its unique local health needs.
- 2. Advise the agency on health care issues and resource allocations.
- 3. Promote public awareness of community health needs, emphasizing health promotion and cost-effective health service selection.
- 4. Collect data and conduct analyses and studies related to health care needs of the district, including the needs of medically indigent persons, and assist the agency and other state agencies in carrying out data collection activities that relate to the functions in this subsection.

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5. Monitor the onsite construction progress, if any, of certificate-of-need approved projects and report council findings to the agency on forms provided by the agency.

- 6. Advise and assist any regional planning councils within each district that have elected to address health issues in their strategic regional policy plans with the development of the health element of the plans to address the health goals and policies in the State Comprehensive Plan.
- 7. Advise and assist local governments within each district on the development of an optional health plan element of the comprehensive plan provided in chapter 163, to assure compatibility with the health goals and policies in the State Comprehensive Plan and district health plan. To facilitate the implementation of this section, the local health council shall annually provide the local governments in its service area, upon request, with:
- a. A copy and appropriate updates of the district health plan;
- b. A report of hospital and nursing home utilization statistics for facilities within the local government jurisdiction; and
- c. Applicable agency rules and calculated need
 methodologies for health facilities and services regulated under
 s. 408.034 for the district served by the local health council.
 - 8. Monitor and evaluate the adequacy, appropriateness, and

effectiveness, within the district, of local, state, federal, and private funds distributed to meet the needs of the medically indigent and other underserved population groups.

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- 9. In conjunction with the Department of Health, plan for services at the local level for persons infected with the human immunodeficiency virus.
- 10. Provide technical assistance to encourage and support activities by providers, purchasers, consumers, and local, regional, and state agencies in meeting the health care goals, objectives, and policies adopted by the local health council.
- 11. Provide the agency with data required by rule for the review of certificate-of-need applications and the projection of need for health services and facilities in the district.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect June 30, 2021.
